WATER MAINTENANCE PROGRAM TO BEGIN

Each year, Pinellas County's drinking water distribution system undergoes a maintenance program in which the disinfectant is temporarily switched from chloramines to chlorine. Clearwater customers are affected by this switch, because the city buys some of its water from Pinellas County. The maintenance program occurs in two different segments each year. The first segment is April 22 to May 11. The second will take place Sept. 23 to Oct. 12.

Some residents may notice a slight difference in the taste or odor of their drinking water. Although the disinfectant is slightly more noticeable, the water is still safe to drink. Residents and businesses with kidney dialysis machines and tropical aquatic life tanks should not be affected, but should contact their respective industries with questions about this temporary change. This routine maintenance is required to ensure the drinking water provided to Clearwater utility customers continues to be of the highest quality. The annual process continues to run smoothly every year. Thank you for your patience.

SPRING BREAK **PARK & RIDE SERVICE TO CLEARWATER BEACH**

The city of Clearwater has teamed up with PSTA to make your trip to Clearwater Beach easier during spring break season. Park & Ride is a program that offers beach visitors a place to park in a free designated lot, and then ride the trolley to the beach for free. The trolley Park & Ride service leaves every 30 minutes from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. Monday through Thursday and every 15 minutes from 10 a.m. to midnight on Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Park for free at the former Clearwater City Hall location, 112 S. Osceola Ave., and board for free there, at the Clearwater Beach Transit Center, and the Clearwater Beach Marina. All riders boarding at these locations get a free day pass for all-day travel on the entire PSTA bus and trolley system. Return service to the parking lot boards at the Clearwater Beach Marina. This service began March 1 and runs through April 30.

IS YOUR UTILITY **ACCOUNT UP TO DATE?**

Clearwater's Utility Customer Service Department has procedures in place to notify customers who may receive a high water bill before the bill comes in the mail. Representatives reach out to those who may have an unusually high water consumption or if their meter is continually running. The goal is to get to the root of the problem quick and to stop the wasting of water (and money!).

But sometimes, the customer's phone number or email address that is listed on the account is outdated, and representatives cannot reach the customer. Make sure that your mailing address, phone number and email address associated with your Clearwater utilities account is correct and up to date. PAINT YOUR HEART OUT SEEKS VOLUNTEERS, DONORS & SPONSORS


