Residents can bring documents that have sensitive information, and they will be shredded. Throwing such items away in the trash is not a good idea, as they can be obtained by criminals who go through your trash. It is designed for Clearwater residents, not businesses. CLEARWATER CAUTIONS CONSUMERS ABOUT WATER QUALITY TESTING SALES PITCHES TESTING SALES PITCHES

Residents should know that companies promoting water quality testing to individual homes are not associated with the city of Clearwater or Clearwater Public Utilities. Private, for-profit water testing companies have been approaching homeowners in Clearwater and throughout Pinellas County, informing them that they should have their water tested for quality. In the past, companies also have made claims to be able to improve the quality and safety of tap water.

All water supplied by the city of Clearwater meets or exceeds all federal and state standards for safe drinking water. The city does not endorse any private water companies, nor does the city's water require additional testing or filtering. Clearwater Public Utilities has stringent processes including water sampling to ensure water quality.

Residents are urged to exercise caution if any company offers free testing, a free gift with demonstration, makes claims or generalizations concerning water contamination or adds a coagulant (or thickener) to your water to solidify harmless minerals. If you're approached by a water testing company, look them up at the Better Business Bureau website at bbb.org before doing business with them. Residents who feel they have been misled in any way should contact the Attorney General's Economic Crimes Office at (813) 287-7900.

CODE SWEEP IN DOWNTOWN GATEWAY

The city's Code Compliance Division staff will carry out a neighborhood sweep on Wednesday, Nov. 6 in the Downtown Gateway, focusing on the area within Drew Street, Court Street, Highland Avenue and Missouri Avenue. Code Compliance officers will inspect residential and commercial properties for a range of violations:

- Yard growth
- Poorly maintained fences
- Trash and debris on the property
- Damaged driveways
- Inoperable vehicles
- Vehicles parked on the grass
- Vehicles with no tags or expired tags
- Hauling trailers
- Exterior surface issues on the home

On Wednesday, Nov. 6 the city's Solid Waste Department will also carry out a bulk collection in the designated sweep zone. Items to be collected must be placed on the curb by 7 a.m. Along with bulk items, the Solid Waste Department will pick up televisions and other electronics.
